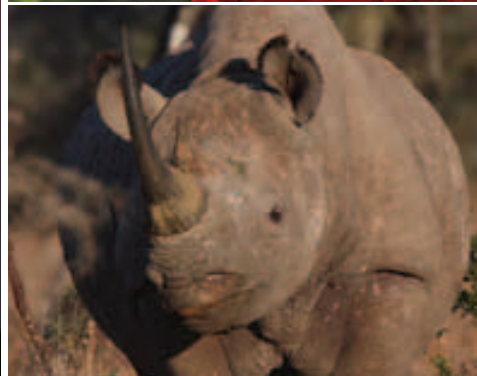

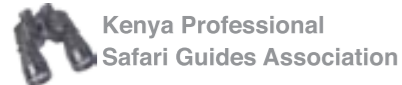
Our Guides
